Artist Jyoti, 12 years old, sells gutka at a railway station. This picture depicts the sun because it gives us light and brightens her life.




Artist Ravi, 8 years old, now attends school! Ravi loves to paint and has used bright, bold colours to depict Holi, his favourite festival.
